Replacing Skies – (Difficult Subjects e.g. Trees)

```
Open image
Select 'Channels'
Pick image most contrasty, e.g. Blue or Red (Highest degree of contrast).
Select 'Image' (from menu)
Select 'Calculations' from dropdown.

Source 1 = Background
Channel = Blue or Red (see above)
Source 2 = Background
Channel = Blue or Red (see above)
Blending = Overlay
Mask = unticked
Result = New Channel
OK.
```

This creates a new alpha channel – "Alpha 1" under the blue channel.

Menus

```
Image, Adjustments, Levels (or CTRL + L) Move arrows -> \& < - until foreground is black and sky is white. OK.
```

Paint over any holes in foreground with a black brush.

Menus

Image, Adjustments, Invert or (CTRL+i)

(CTRL +) while clicking on the Alpha Channel to create a mask.

Click on RGB Channel.

Click on Layers Tab

Now drag your image using the move tool (V) onto a new background image (sky). Holding down the shift key will make the two images fit together in unison.
